Died at West Boylston, Mass.

Corporal. Mustered out October 20, 1864. Expiration of service. Died November 26, 1864 at Boylston.

Corporal. Re-enlisted, killed at Cold Harbor Va. June 3, 1864, and was buried on the field.

Transferred August 15, 1863 to Signal Corps. Taken prisoner February 1864. Near Newbern N.C. died in Andersonville Ga. Prison, a Graduate of Westfield Normal School. Re-enlisted, Mustered out July 13, 1865. Expiration of service.

Discharged June 1, 1865. Order of War Department. Died January 8, 1901 aged 82 years 8 mos.

Corporal. Mustered out September 2, 1863. Expiration of service.

Taken prisoner and was eight months in Rebel Prison. Discharged June 1, 1865. Expiration of service. Returned home and afterwards resided in Boylston where he died April 13, 1884, of Chronic Enteritis aged 53 years.
